The Council for the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings and the Foundation Lindau Nobelprizewinners Meetings at Lake Constance feel honoured to welcome 61 Nobel Laureates and 650 excellent young researchers from 70 countries to the 60th Lindau Meeting of Nobel Laureates.

"Young people here should be well aware of the importance of science and the necessity of science to go on." These words with which Nobel Laureate Rita Levi-Montalcini (born 1909) addressed participants of the 1992 Lindau Meeting could be chosen as the key note for any Lindau Meeting: What started as a European initiative for reconciliation and scientific dialogue in the aftermath of the Second World War has developed into a truly international platform for the intensive exchange on pressing problems of the planet. The most relevant topics in science and society find their place in the agenda of the annual Lindau Meetings.

For the third time we gather for an interdisciplinary dialogue, crossing disciplinary borders to inspire further research. In today's world, complexity and contingency are real life features that do not stop at the boundaries of the traditional science disciplines. Our tradition-steeped workshop for the future invites all of you to discuss scientific challenges from different perspectives, to learn from each other and to exchange your views about the future of science and research.

In the year 2000, the Foundation Lindau Nobelprizewinners Meetings at Lake Constance was established following an initiative by 50 Laureates. As of now, 231 Laureates give testimony to our Mission Education as members of the Founders Assembly. The Foundation has developed into a genuine second pillar and a sound basis for the Lindau Dialogue to unfold. Not only has it provided for the necessary financial backing, it has also played a major role in the internationalisation of the Lindau Meetings. Scientific excellence and the Foundation's trusteeship help us frame the Lindau dialogue in the future.
