

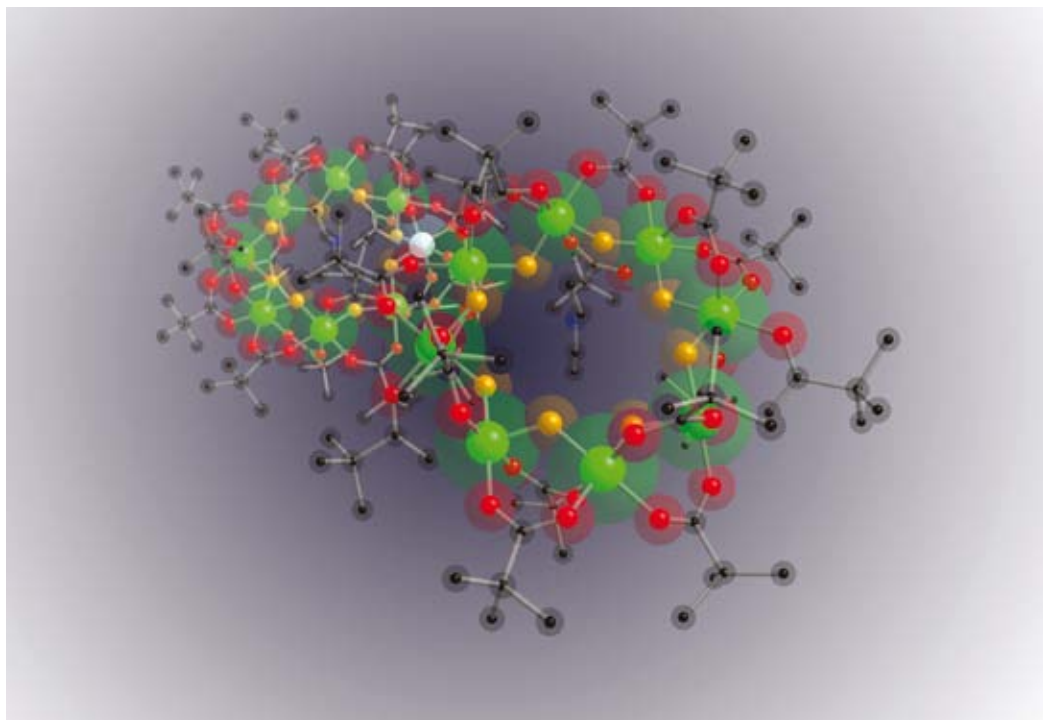

## Call for Papers

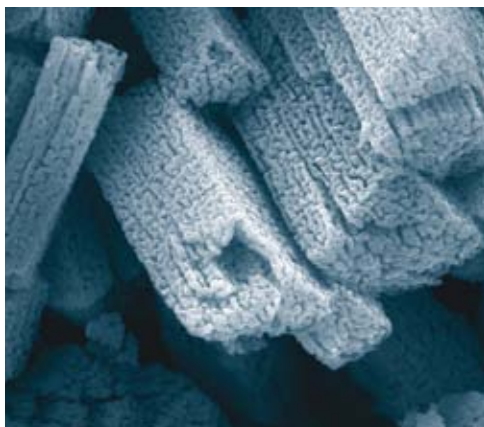
Offers of abstracts are now invited (for both oral and poster presentation) within the themes and topics listed opposite. Deadlines for submission are also listed opposite.

The conference banquet will take place at Manchester United Football Club on the evening of Wednesday 13 April. Delegates will be able to book tickets for this event when registering.
